



Homestay

Homestay accommodation gives you the opportunity to live with a local family in their home. You'll get to use English in everyday situations and experience the Australian lifestyle. All homestay hosts have met safety and welfare requirements.

- A\$350 per week (all meals included, except lunch on week days)
A\$260 per week (cook your own meals)*
- Your own fully furnished bedroom
- Shared bathroom

* Students under 18 must take the meals included option



Independent accommodation

Independent rental can be a great option once you know your way around Adelaide. It can also be less expensive, particularly if you're sharing with other people.

Visit www.realestate.com.au and select 'rent'.

Be careful that you fully understand the terms of an independent rental contract. This type of accommodation is not arranged by Eynesbury. We do not recommend independent rental unless you're already living in Adelaide and feel confident to find your own accommodation.

- A\$300+ per week for 1 bedroom, 1 bathroom.
A\$600+ for a larger house.
- Most rental properties are not furnished. You will need to buy furniture, cutlery, crockery, bed linen, towels and electrical equipment. You will also need to cover the cost of the electricity, gas and water for the house, plus your own food costs, internet and public transport (if in a suburban area).

All priced in A\$. All accommodation types require a bond to be paid. This is usually equal to 2 - 4 weeks' rent. The bond is a separate payment and is not the same thing as paying rent in advance. For independent rental the bond is lodged with the State Government and will be reimbursed when you move out, provided there is no damage to the property and no outstanding rent or bills. You also need to give a minimum amount of notice if you decide to leave your accommodation. *Prices are current at the time of printing and may be subject to change.

Foundation Studies Program

The Foundation Studies Program equips you with the essential academic skills and knowledge needed for entry into Adelaide University. It prepares you for either the first year of a bachelor’s degree or a diploma pathway, providing a solid foundation in key areas such as communication, problem-solving, and research to help ensure your academic success at university.

What you’ll be studying

In the Foundation Studies Program, you will complete three core modules, and three elective modules based on your area of study interest. Assessment is based on a total score out of 500, which is used to determine your eligibility for entry into Adelaide University. This flexible structure allows you to tailor your studies to your future academic and career goals while building a strong foundation for success.






