Small class sizes and academic support

Eynesbury College offers small class sizes, experienced teachers and close academic guidance to support students in preparation for university. A dedicated team of student support staff provide a range of services, information, learning support and counselling to students throughout their studies at Eynesbury.

The campus has disability access as well as modern facilities, equipment and learning resources, including computer rooms, kitchen facilities, a resource centre, dry and wet laboratories and break-out areas.



Fast-track options and multiple intakes

With intakes in February, June and October, students can start their studies when it suits them best. It is possible to complete Foundation Studies or a Diploma in as little as 8 months and fast-track into the second year at the University of Adelaide or at the University of South Australia for most programs, subject to program and academic requirements.

All students have the opportunity to make new friendships and join monthly student events and activities, such as job search workshops, excursions, BBQs and various cultural celebrations.

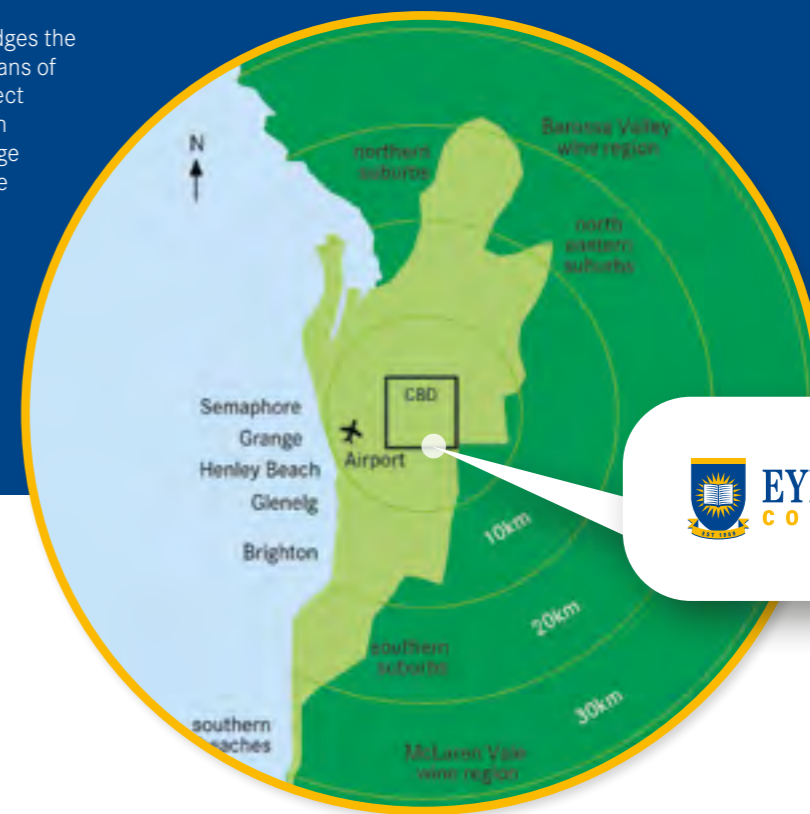

- Students can expect their IELTS to improve 0.5 for each 10 week block of successful study.

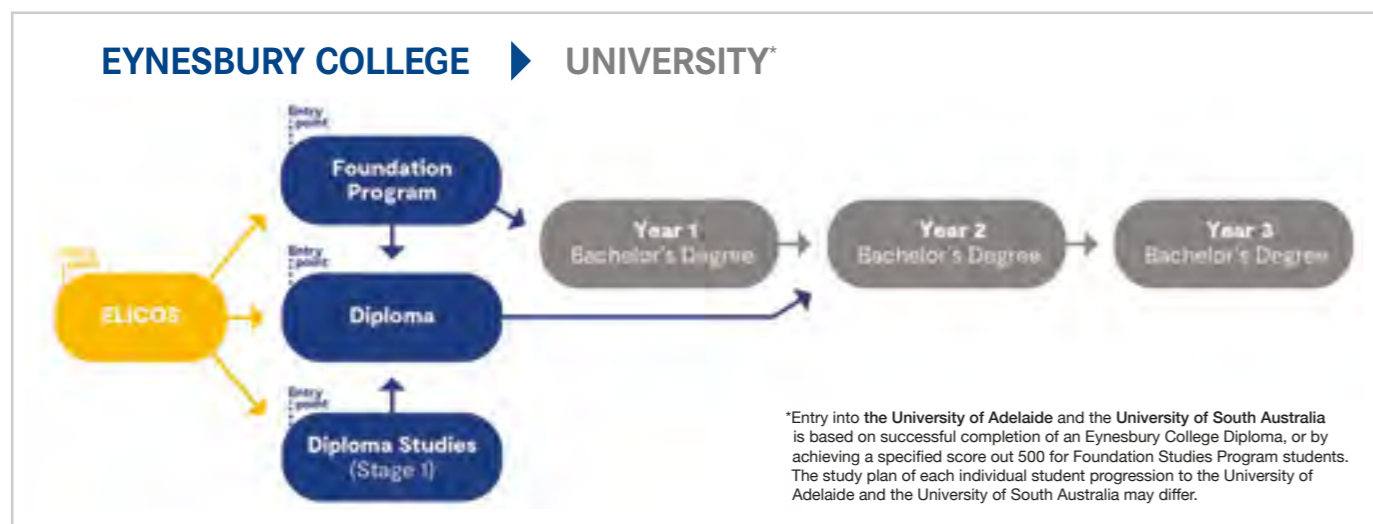
Foundation Studies Program

- A wide range of modules allow you to meet degree pre-requisites.

- Eynesbury Diploma programs are specialised into streams of Business, Engineering and Computing & IT.
- Multiple intakes allow students to complete a diploma in as little as 8 months, with direct entry into second year at the University of Adelaide and the University of South Australia for most programs, subject to program and academic requirements.
- Students will study equivalent course content as is taught in the first year of the university degree.
