## Application for a Student Guardian visa

The Department of Immigration and Border Protection (the department) acknowledges that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples are the traditional custodians of the Australian land.

#### Life in Australia – Australian values

The Australian Government encourages people to gain an understanding of Australia, its people and their way of life, before applying for a visa to live in Australia. As part of this application every person aged 18 years or over must declare that they will respect Australian values, as outlined below and obey the laws of Australia.

Australian values include respect for the freedom and dignity of the individual, freedom of religion, commitment to the rule of law, Parliamentary democracy, equality of men and women and a spirit of egalitarianism that embraces mutual respect, tolerance, fair play and compassion for those in need and pursuit of the public good.

#### Australian society also values equality of opportunity for individuals, regardless of their race, religion or ethnic background.

It is also important to understand that English is the national language.

Further information is contained in the *Life in Australia* booklet, however, you are not required to read the booklet. The booklet is available in a wide range of languages. If you would like a copy of the booklet it can be obtained from **www.immi.gov.au** 

#### Information on studying in Australia

All Student Guardian visa applicants must make a declaration that they have read the **www.studyinaustralia.gov.au** website. This contains information on studying and living in Australia. Information can also be obtained from state and territory governments and education providers.

#### About this form

Important – Please read this information carefully before you complete your application. Once you have completed your application we strongly advise that you keep a copy for your records.

#### Who should use this form?

You should use this form if you are:

- outside Australia and intend to apply for a Student Guardian visa; or
- in Australia and intend to apply for a further Student Guardian visa; or
- a visitor, working holiday-maker or other temporary visa holder intending to extend your stay in Australia to reside with a student as their guardian.

#### Integrity of application

The department is committed to maintaining the integrity of the visa and citizenship programmes. In relation to this application, if you or a member of your family unit:

- provide, or have provided in a previous application, fraudulent documents or false or misleading information (knowingly or not); and/or
- fail to satisfy, or have failed to satisfy in a previous application, the Minister of your or their identity;

this visa application may be refused and you, and any members of your family unit, may become unable to be granted a visa for specified periods of time, as set out in migration legislation.

If information or documents are found to be fraudulent or misleading after the grant of a visa, it may subsequently be cancelled.

#### Applying for a Student Guardian visa

If you wish to apply to enter or remain in Australia as a student guardian, complete this form in ENGLISH using BLOCK LETTERS.

In order to complete this form you should first read these notes and the information sheet *Applying for a student guardian visa*, available from your nearest Australian Government office overseas or the department's website

To help you lodge your application and communicate with the department while your application is being processed you should read information form 1025i *Making and processing visa applications*, which is available from the department's website **www.immi.gov.au/allforms**/

Every applicant for a Student Guardian visa must satisfy the criteria for grant. These criteria include, but are not limited to, a genuine temporary entrant requirement, your relationship to the nominating student, your age, financial capacity, family composition and arrangements for any dependant family members, intention to comply with visa conditions and other relevant matters. Information on these criteria and the conditions, which are likely to be attached to your visa, can be found in the information sheet *Applying for a student guardian visa*, or on the department's website.

Your application may be decided solely on the basis of information provided in this application. Failure to answer a question may result in your application being refused if the decision maker cannot be satisfied that you meet all of the criteria for grant of the visa. The provision of information to the department, which is incorrect, may result in cancellation of your visa if it is granted. If you need more space to answer any question, write the details on a separate sheet, sign it and attach it to the application form. You must provide all of the documentation necessary to support your application (originals or certified or notarised copies) and you must declare that you have done so. Failure to do so may result in your application being refused. A decision on your application will be made on the basis of all the information you provide, your circumstances and the legal requirements which apply. If your circumstances change in any way after you make your application you must inform the department of the new circumstances. Failure to do so can lead to cancellation of your visa if it is granted.

Applicants who provide false or misleading information may either have their applications refused, or their visa permitting them to remain in Australia cancelled.

#### Applying in Australia

If you:

- are applying in Australia; and
- do not already hold a Student Guardian visa; and
- the student nominating you as their guardian is subject to Assessment Level 2 or 3 for their visa

you must provide exceptional reasons for the grant of your visa in Australia.

#### Welfare arrangements for students under 18 years of age

The department bears no responsibility for welfare arrangements made on a student's behalf. It is the responsibility of the parents or legal custodians of a student under the age of 18 to ensure that the arrangements they make on the student's behalf provide appropriate welfare for the entirety of the student's stay in Australia while they are under the age of 18. If welfare arrangements break down, the parents or legal custodians must make new welfare arrangements or the student under the age of 18 must depart Australia. It is a visa requirement that appropriate welfare arrangements are maintained while the student is under the age of 18.

Form 157N *Nomination of a student guardian* must be completed and lodged together with this form. Failure to do so will result in your application being invalid.

#### Photographs

**Applying outside Australia** – enclose 4 recent passport sized photographs of yourself and any family members included in this application.

**Applying in Australia** – enclose one recent passport sized photograph of yourself and any family members included in this application.

#### Health requirements

All applicants are required to meet Australia's health requirements. You and any family members included in this application, may be required to undergo a chest x-ray and medical examination. For more information, refer to the department's website **www.immi.gov.au/allforms/healthrequirements/health-exam.htm** 

If applying outside Australia you should not undertake your medical or x-ray examinations until advised to do so by the Australian Government office.

#### **Character requirements**

All applicants are required to meet Australia's character requirements. More information on character requirements and penal clearances is available from the department's website **www.immi.gov.au/allforms**/

#### Members of your family unit

Members of your family unit are your partner and dependent children of you or your partner, who are unmarried, not in a de facto relationship and who have not turned 18 years of age.

**'Partner**' means your spouse or de facto partner (including same-sex partners).

You or members of your family unit may only be eligible for the grant of a Student Guardian visa if you have no members of your family unit less than 6 years of age unless:

- the grant of your visa would significantly benefit the relationship between the Australian Government and the government of another country; or
- the child under 6 years of age holds a passport that is subject to Assessment Level 1 or 2 for the Schools Sector (subclass 571) Student visa and compassionate and compelling circumstances exist.

#### **Visa conditions**

If you are issued a Student Guardian visa, some conditions will be attached to the visa. These are the most common conditions. You:

- must not engage in work while in Australia (condition 8101);
- must not engage, for more than 3 months, in any studies or training. You have unlimited part-time study rights for English Language Intensive Courses for Overseas Students (ELICOS) study only. This means that you may study any ELICOS courses less than 20 hours per week for the duration of your visa (condition 8201);
- must maintain your approved Overseas Visitor Health Cover while in Australia (condition 8501);
- will be subject to a 'no further stay' condition (condition 8534). This means that after entering Australia, you may not be granted any other visa while you remain in Australia, other than a further Student Guardian visa, or a Protection visa;
- must continue to be a person who would satisfy the primary criteria for the grant of the Student Guardian visa (condition 8516);
- must reside in Australia, staying with the nominating student to whom your visa relates. You must also provide appropriate accommodation, general welfare and other support arrangements for the nominating student (condition 8537);
- must not depart Australia without the nominating student to whom your visa relates unless you have provided evidence to the department that there are compassionate or compelling circumstances and that you have put in place alternative arrangements until your return for the nominating student's accommodation, general welfare and support. Where the nominating student is less than 18 years, the alternative arrangements must be approved by the nominating student's education provider (condition 8538).

Different conditions are attached to Student Guardian visas granted to children to accompany a parent to Australia. The conditions applying to children are:

- they must not work in Australia (condition 8101);
- they must maintain their approved Overseas Visitor Health Cover while in Australia (condition 8501);
- they must not enter Australia before a specified person (this will usually be the main Student Guardian visa holder) (condition 8502);
- they must continue to be a person who would satisfy the criteria for grant of a Student Guardian visa (condition 8516).

#### Lodging your application

#### If applying in Australia

Your application must be lodged at the correct address for this visa application. More information about Student Guardian visas and lodgement addresses is available from the department's website **www.immi.gov.au/visas/pages/580.aspx**. Please read the information under 'How to apply' for the correct lodgement address for this application.

#### If applying outside Australia

Your application should be lodged at the same time and place as the nominating student. If the nominating student is already in Australia, information about Student Guardian visas and lodgement addresses is available from the department's website **www.immi.gov.au/visas/pages/580.aspx**. Please read the information under 'How to apply' for the correct lodgement address for this application.

#### **Visa Application Charge**

Refer to *Payment details* of this form to calculate the correct charge and make payment.

Refer to **www.immi.gov.au/fees-charges** for a complete and current list of applicable fees and charges.

Fees and charges may be subject to change at any time and this may increase the cost of a visa application.

Generally, Visa Application Charges are reviewed on 1 July each year, and the exchange rates used to calculate the amount payable in a foreign country are updated on 1 January and 1 July each year.

If you do not pay the full Visa Application Charge amount, your visa application will not be valid.

Charges are generally not refundable, even if the application is withdrawn or refused.

#### Method of payment

#### In Australia

To make a payment, please pay by credit card, debit card, bank cheque or money order made payable to the Department of Immigration and Border Protection. Debit card and credit card are the preferred methods of payment.

#### **Outside Australia**

Before making a payment outside Australia, please check with the Australian Government office where you intend to lodge your application as to what methods of payment and currencies they can accept and to whom the payment should be made payable.

#### Immigration assistance

A person gives immigration assistance to you if he or she uses, or claims to use, his or her knowledge or experience in migration procedure to assist you with your visa application, request for ministerial intervention, cancellation review application, sponsorship or nomination.

In Australia a person may only lawfully give immigration assistance if he or she is a registered migration agent or is exempt from being registered. Only registered migration agents may receive a fee or reward for providing immigration assistance.

If an unregistered person in Australia, who is not exempt from registration, gives you immigration assistance they are committing a criminal offence and may be prosecuted.

#### Migration agents in Australia

Migration agents in Australia must be registered with the Office of the Migration Agents Registration Authority (Office of the MARA) unless they are exempt from registration.

#### Migration agents outside Australia

Migration agents who operate outside Australia do not have to be registered. The department may give some overseas agents an ID number. This number does not mean that they are registered.

**Note**: Some Australian registered migration agents operate overseas.

#### Migration agent information

A migration agent is someone who can:

- advise you on the visa that may best suit you;
- tell you the documents you need to submit with your application;
- help you fill in the application and submit it; and
- communicate with the department on your behalf.

If you appoint a migration agent, the department will assume that your migration agent will be your authorised recipient, unless you indicate otherwise.

Your migration agent will be the person with whom the department will discuss your application and from whom it will seek further information when required.

You are not required to use a migration agent. However, if you use a migration agent, the department encourages you to use a registered migration agent. Registered agents are bound by the Migration Agents Code of Conduct, which requires them to act professionally in their clients' lawful best interests.

#### Exempt persons

The following people do not have to be a registered migration agent in order to provide immigration assistance, but they must not charge a fee for their service:

- a close family member (spouse, de facto partner, child, parent, brother or sister);
- a member of parliament or their staff;
- an official whose duties include providing immigration assistance (eg. a Legal Aid provider);
- a member of a diplomatic mission, consular post or international organisation.

#### Appointing a migration agent/exempt person

To appoint a migration agent/exempt person you should complete Question 51 *Options for receiving written communications*.

Your migration agent/exempt person should complete form 956 Advice by a migration agent/exempt person of providing immigration assistance.

Form 956 is available from the department's website **www.immi.gov.au/allforms**/

#### Options for receiving written communications

If you do not appoint a migration agent/exempt person you may still authorise another person, in writing, to receive written communications on your behalf. This person is called the authorised recipient.

#### Authorised recipient information

All written communication about your application will be sent to your authorised recipient, unless you indicate that you wish to have health and/or character information sent directly to you.

The department will communicate with the most recently appointed authorised recipient as you may only appoint one authorised recipient at any time for a particular application.

You will be taken to have received any documents sent to that person as if they had been sent to you.

To appoint an authorised recipient you should complete:

- Question 51 Options for receiving written communications; and
- form 956A Appointment or withdrawal of an authorised recipient.

**Note**: Migration agents/exempt persons do not need to complete form 956A.

#### Consent to communicate electronically

The department may use a range of means to communicate with you. However, electronic means such as fax or email will only be used if you indicate your agreement to receiving communication in this way.

To process your application the department may need to communicate with you about sensitive information, for example, health, police checks, financial viability and personal relationships. Electronic communications, unless adequately encrypted, are not secure and may be viewed by others or interfered with.

If you agree to the department communicating with you by electronic means, the details you provide will only be used by the department for the purpose for which you have provided them, unless there is a legal obligation or necessity to use them for another purpose, or you have consented to use for another purpose. They will not be added to any mailing list.

The Australian Government accepts no responsibility for the security or integrity of any information sent to the department over the internet or by other electronic means.

If you authorise another person to receive documents on your behalf and they wish to be contacted electronically, their signature is required on form 956 or 956A to indicate their consent to this form of communication.

**Note**: Electronic communication is the fastest means of communication available and the department prefers to communicate electronically because this results in faster processing.

#### **Residential address**

You must tell the department where you intend to live while your application is being dealt with. Failure to give a residential address will result in your application being invalid. A post office box address will not be accepted as your residential address.

#### Important information about privacy

Your personal information is protected by law, including the *Privacy Act 1988*. Important information about the collection, use and disclosure (to other agencies and third parties, including overseas entities) of your personal information, including sensitive information, is contained in form 1442i *Privacy notice*. Form 1442i is available from the department's website **www.immi.gov.au/allforms**/ or offices of the department. You should ensure that you read and understand form 1442i before completing this form.


